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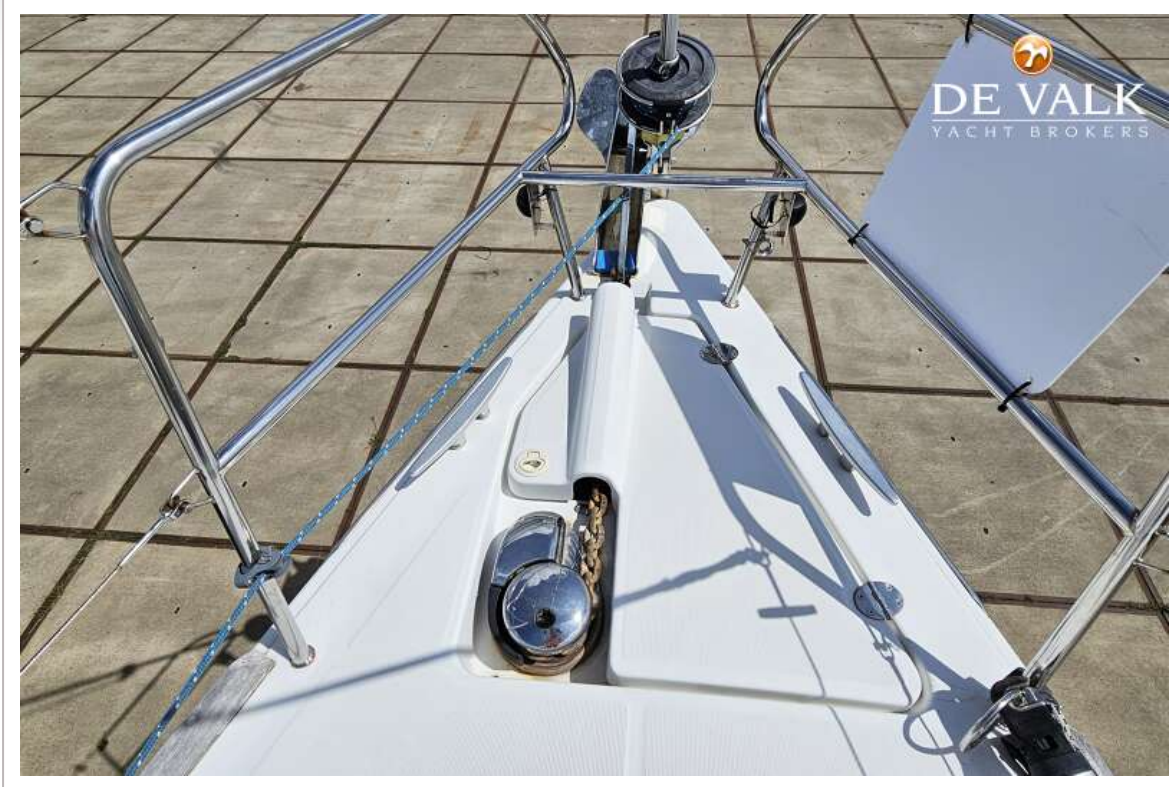
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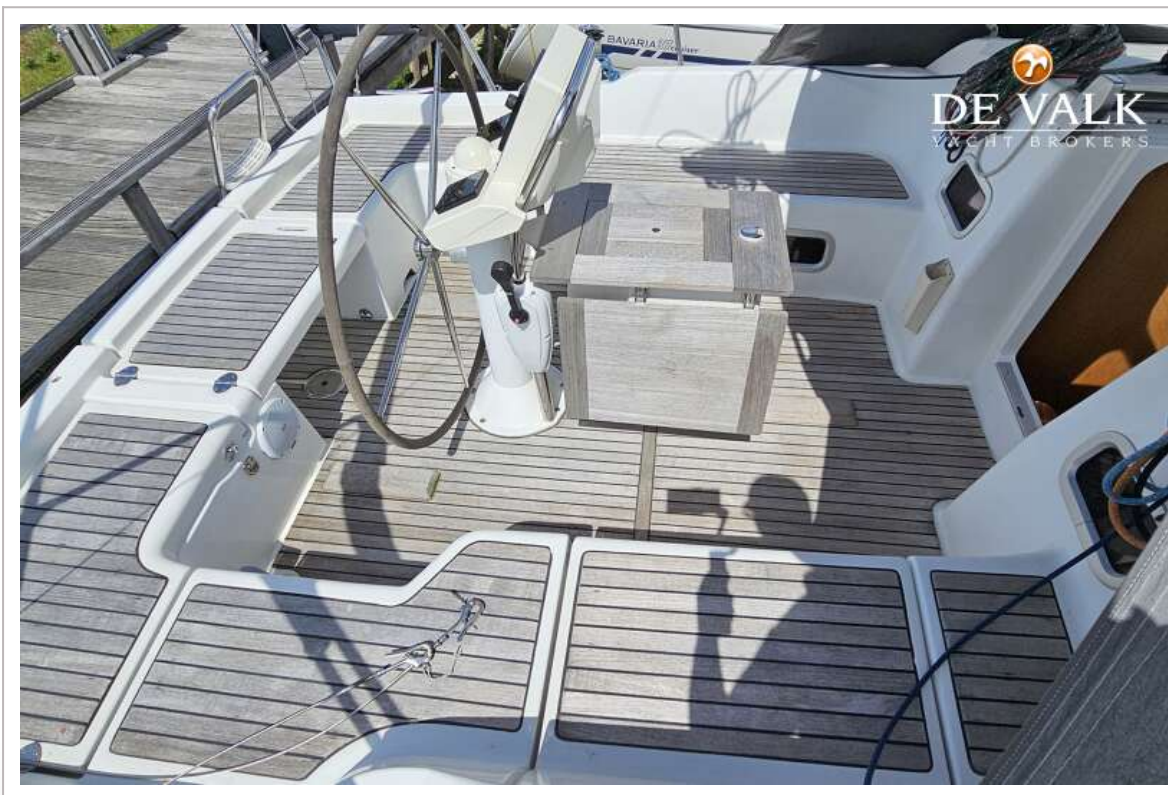
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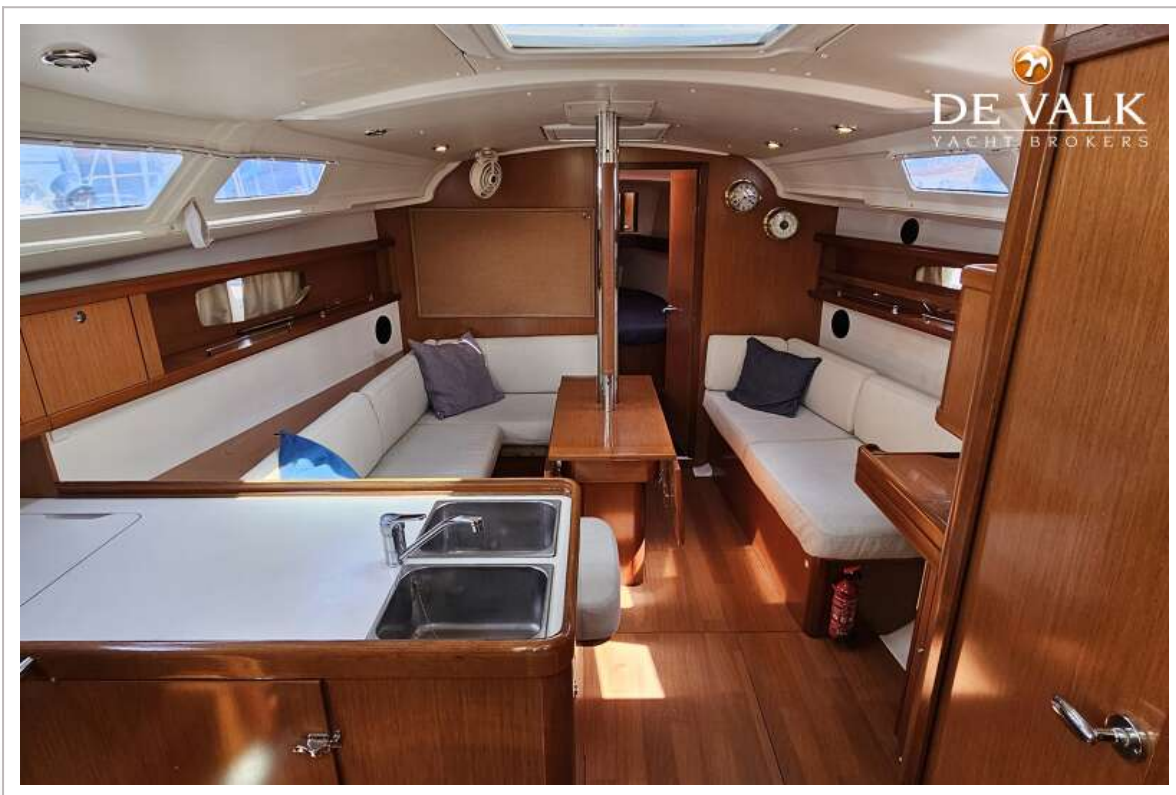
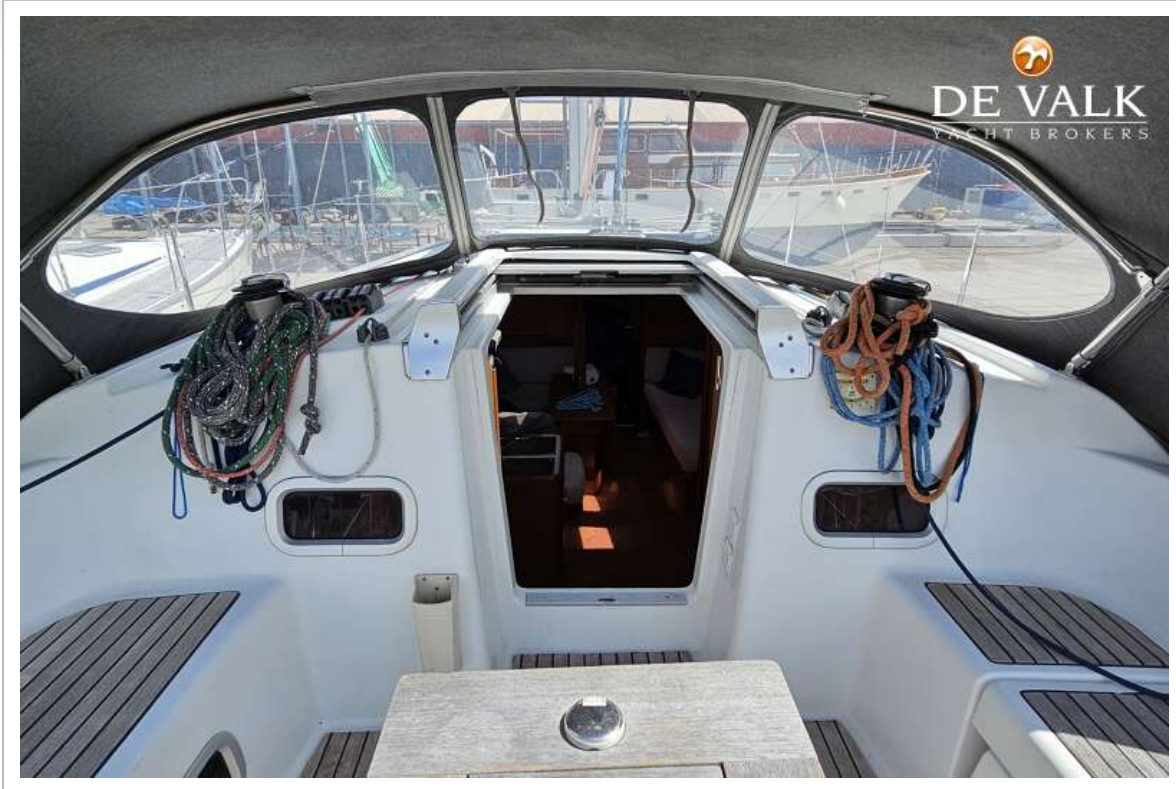
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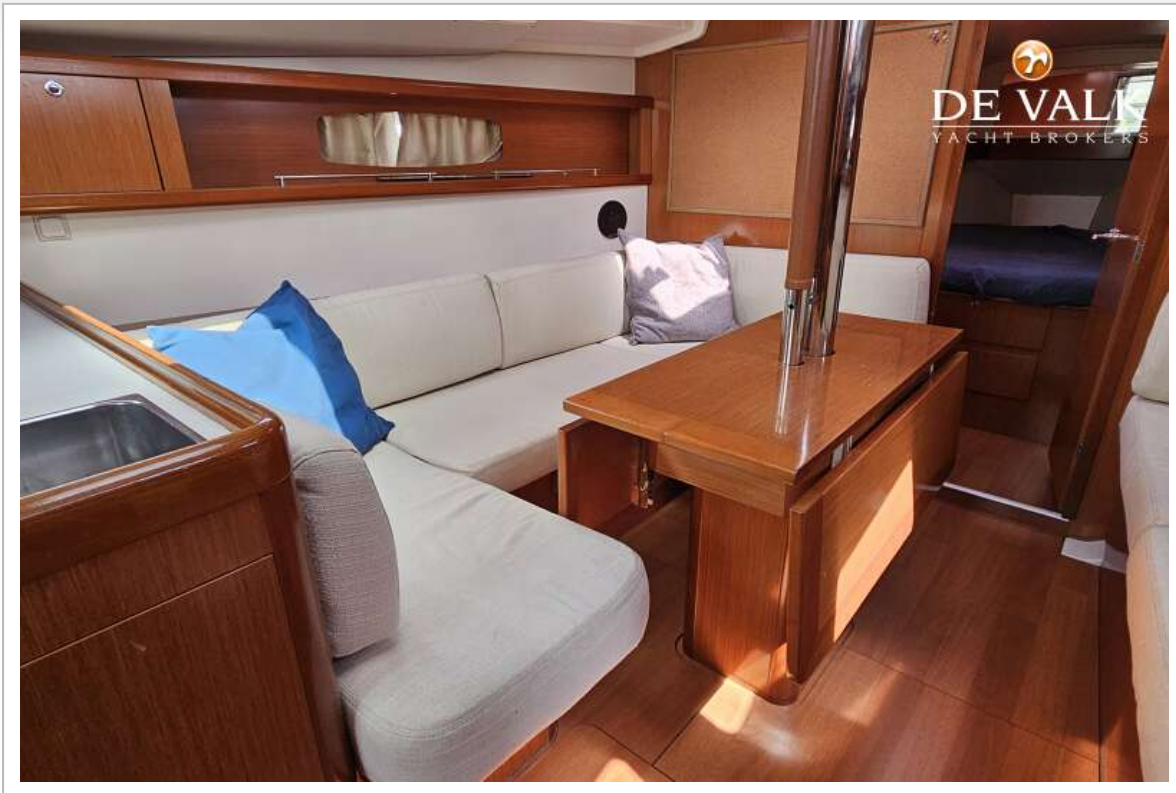
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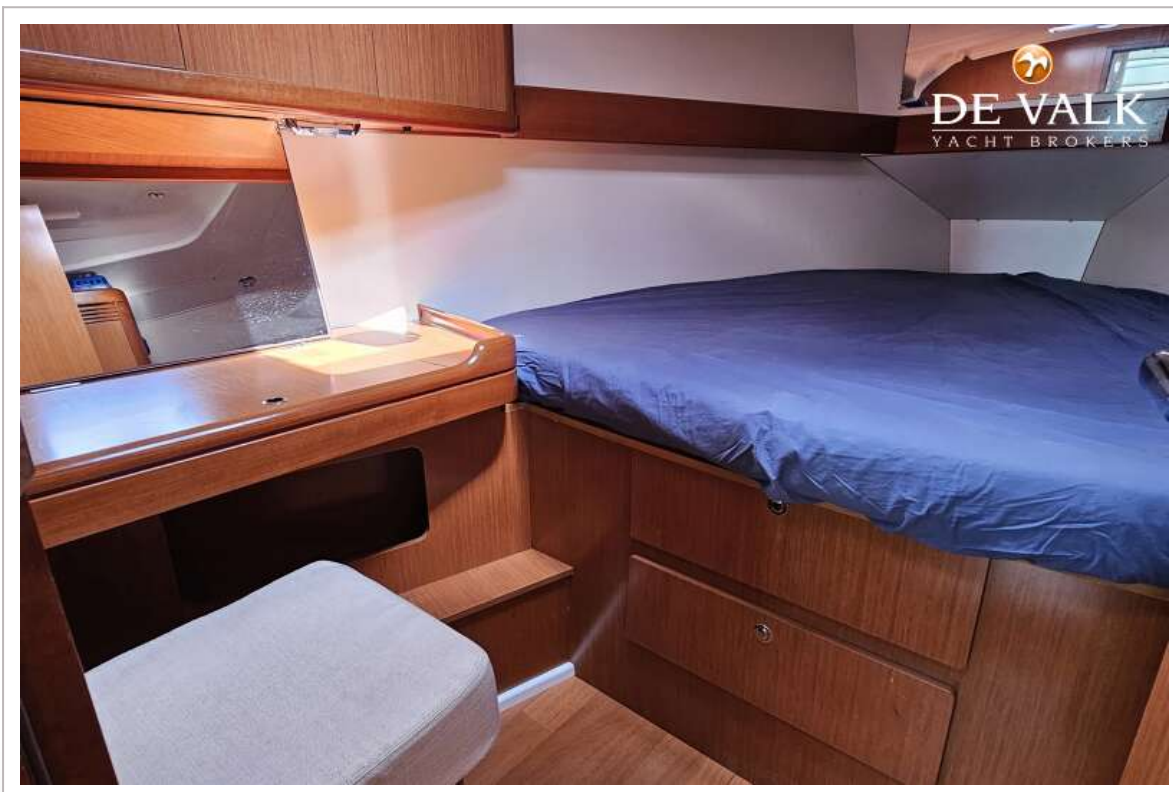
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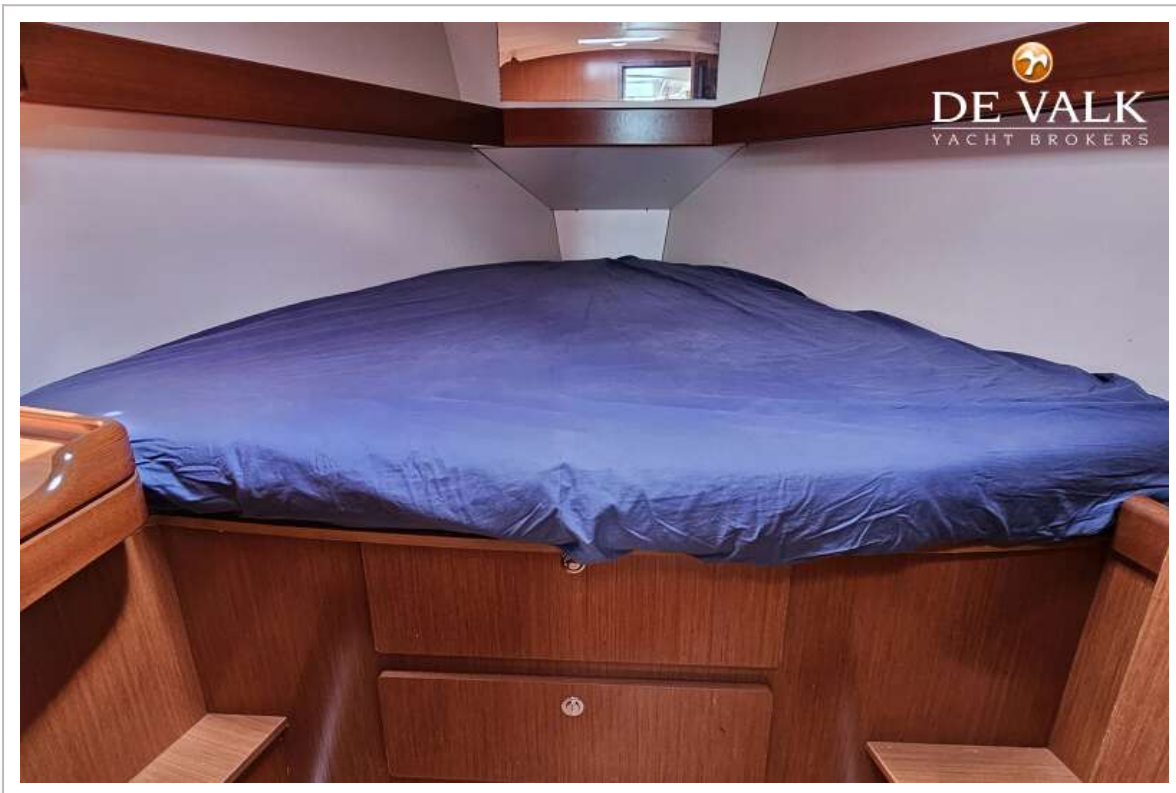
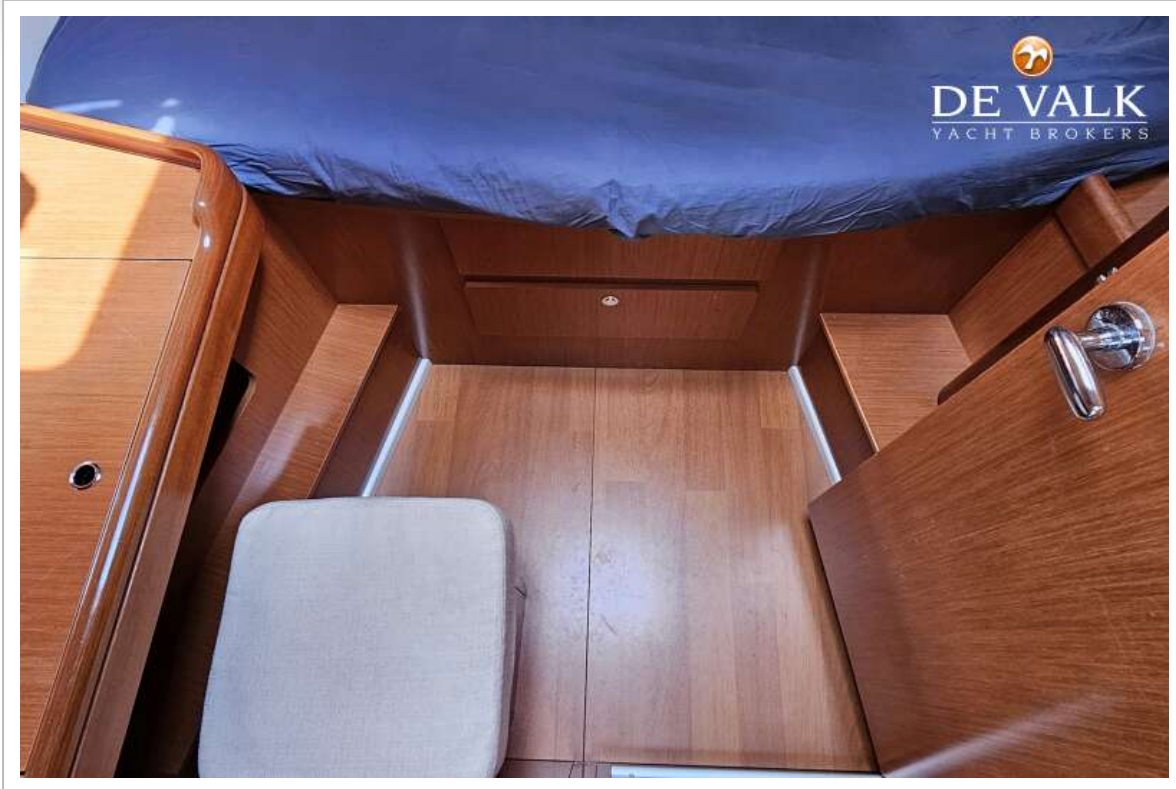
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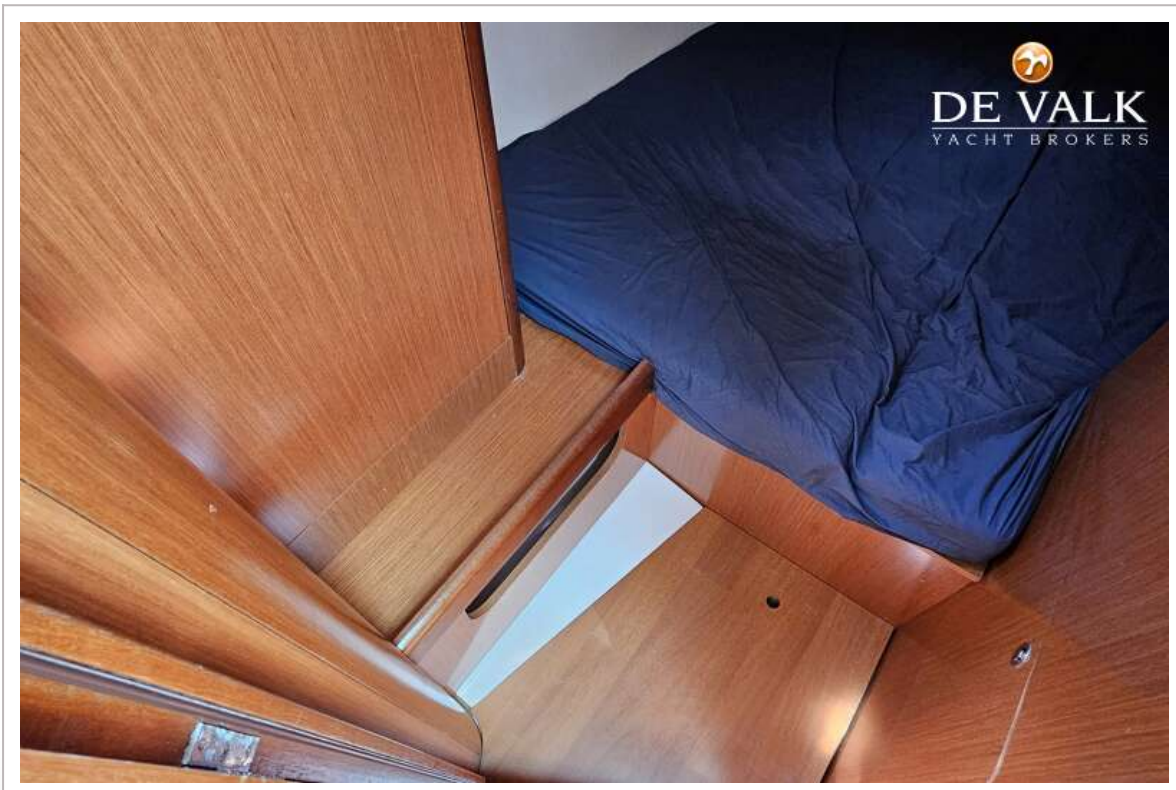
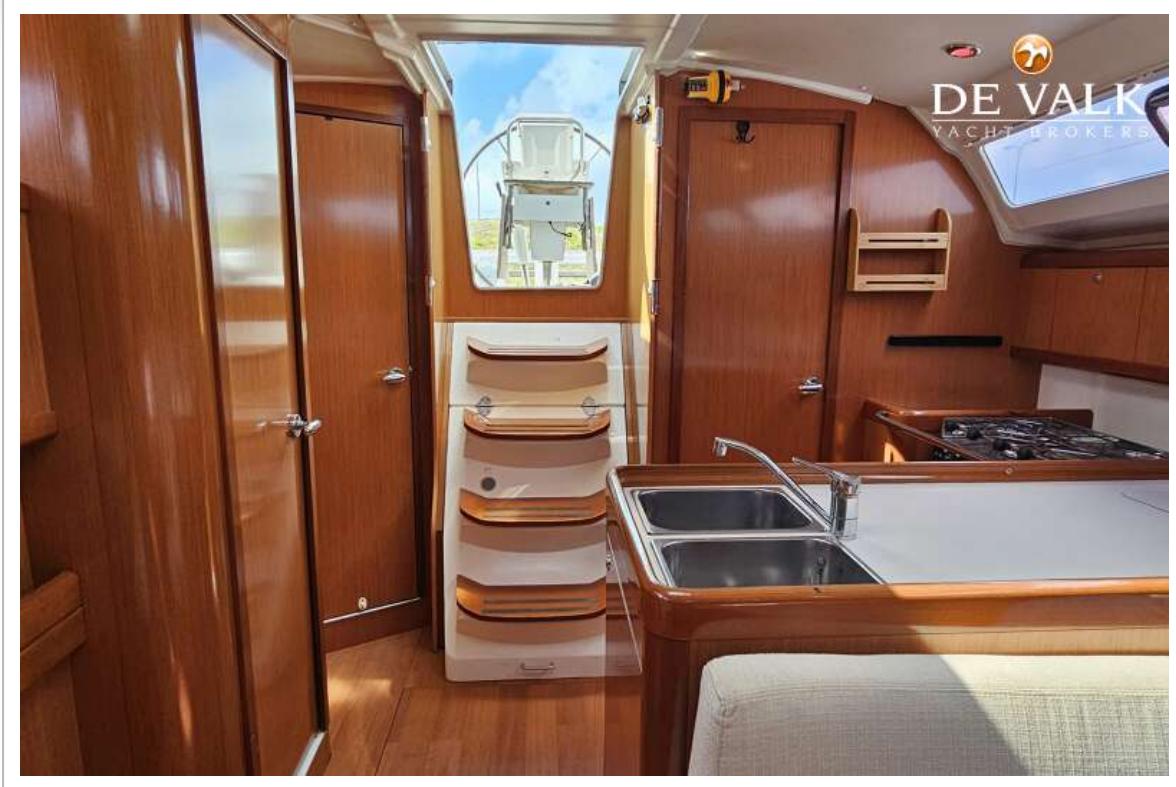
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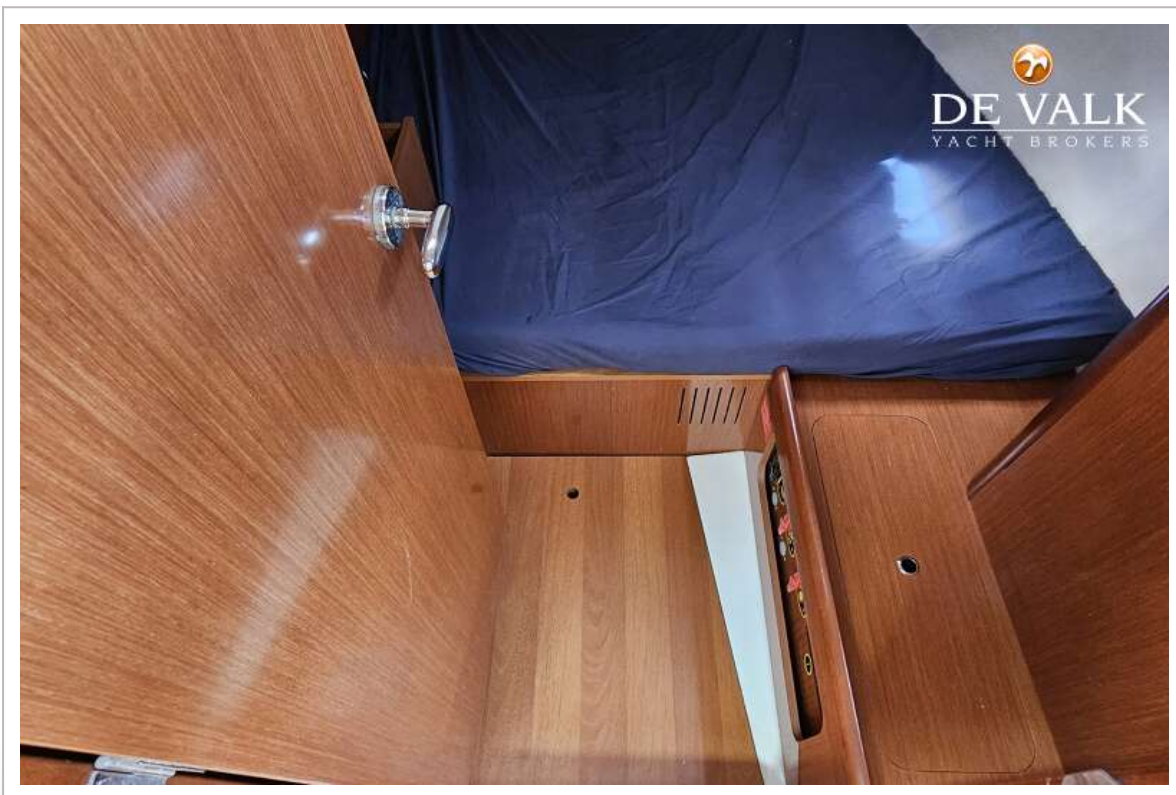
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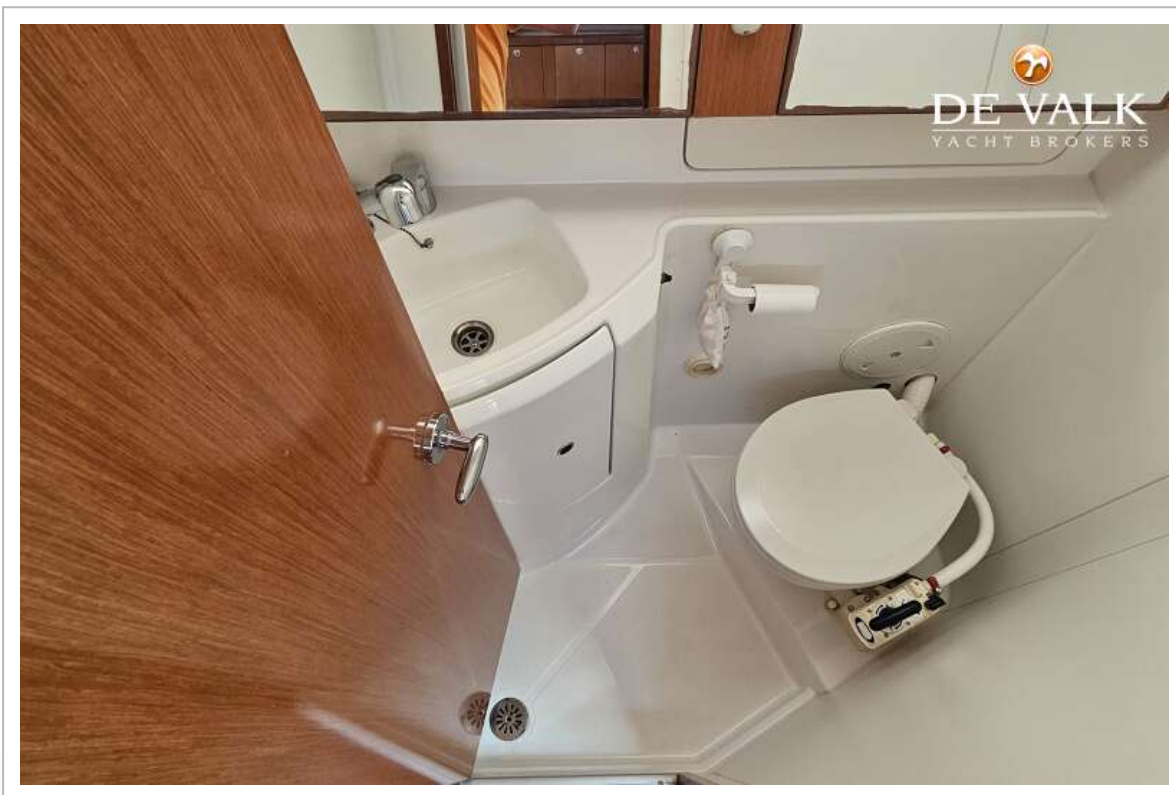
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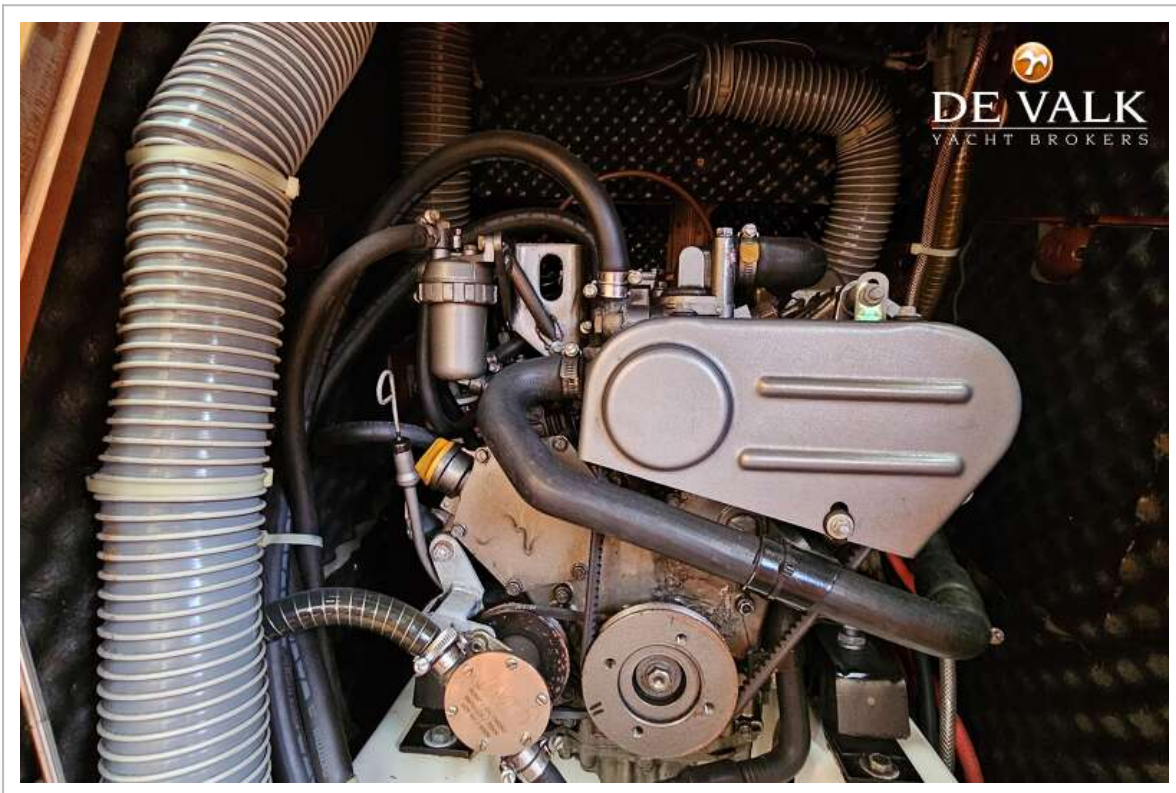
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FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS



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What is the reason for selling your yacht?

After five wonderful years in which we enjoyed this comfortable and seaworthy ship, both at home and abroad, we have decided to emigrate to our beloved Portugal. Although the Portuguese coast is breathtaking, it is less suitable for the type of sailing adventures we love. That is why, with pain in our hearts but also with gratitude, we gladly pass on the helm to a new owner who will enjoy this ship as much as we do.

How many owners has your yacht had and when?

The yacht has had two owners in total. It was originally purchased by two Belgian gentlemen, who sold it to me and a good friend after a short time due to financial circumstances. After about a year my friend retired and I took over his share. Since then I have been the sole owner and have maintained the ship with great care and love together with my girlfriend.

What can you tell about the history and cruising area of your yacht?

The yacht started its journey on the Belgian coast, where the first owners sailed for a short time. Then it was in Herkingen, on the Grevelingenmeer, for two years, where we got to know the ship further and prepared it for bigger adventures. In 2021 our Atlantic sailing adventure began: a dream journey of two years along the European coast, via the Canary Islands to the Caribbean and back via the Azores. The ship has proven itself in all these conditions as reliable, comfortable and completely seaworthy.

Why did you choose for this yacht when you bought it?

We chose this yacht at the time because of its modern look, sleek and timeless design and good sailing characteristics. The ship is known as fast, maneuverable and comfortable, perfect for both touring and longer sailing trips. The rave reviews and solid reputation in the sailing world gave us immediate confidence that this was the right ship for our plans.

What is the special meaning of the name of the yacht for you?

We chose Ocean Monkey because my girlfriend and I both have the Monkey zodiac sign in Chinese astrology. In addition, we wanted to move away from the often clichéd ship names with a wink. Ocean Monkey is playful, unique and memorable, exactly what we were looking for. Nice detail: at the time we were the only Ocean Monkey on the AIS, which made it easy and fun for those at home and other sailors to follow us.

Has your yacht ever been used for charter? And if so, when?

What can you tell about the sailing characteristics of your yacht?

The ship is fast and lively; even with a light breeze you immediately feel how it accelerates. A pleasure to sail. It combines the sporty underwater hull of a First with the comfortable rigging and interior of an Oceanis. A successful mix of performance and comfort. Ideal for those who want to sail sporty as well as want to cruise relaxed.

We are also proud of the ship's self-sufficiency thanks to the solar panels. Since the installation we have never had to connect it to shore power. Only on very gloomy, cloudy days (after day two) did we have to let the engine run for a while to charge the batteries. This sustainable solution gives us maximum freedom and independence while sailing.

What did you do with your yacht during the winter?

During the winter periods we always took the ship out of the water and put it on the shore at Dirk Duyvendijk.
